UNITED WAY PROGRAMS

AIRBUS FOUNDATION FLYING CHALLENGE

The Flying Challenge is a mentoring program focused on character development and STEM activities for children attending Palmer Pillans Middle School. The program presents the opportunity for Airbus employees to provide career exploration, life skills discussions, educational activities, and academic enrichment to middle school students. The goal is to enhance students' life options by improving their grades, inspiring them to finish high school, and stimulating their interest in an aviation-related career.

CLARKE COUNTY OUTREACH CENTER (CCOC)

The Clarke County Outreach Center in Grove Hill was made possible through an Alabama Power Foundation Elevate Grant. The CCOC is a central hub for UWSWA partner agencies serving Clarke County and surrounding counties to meet and provide their full spectrum of services to residents of the county and is not be limited to programs funded by UWSWA. Having a physical presence in Clarke County helps mitigate transportation challenges as well as increase awareness of the programs and services available to residents.

DOLLY PARTON'S IMAGINATION LIBRARY

Each month after a child is registered—up until their 5th birthday—Dolly Parton's Imagination Library sends an age-appropriate book to the child's home at no cost to the family. Currently, children who live in Choctaw County and Mobile County living within the zip codes 36509, 36582, 36587, 36605, 36610, 36615, or 36617 are eligible. Program availability is dependent on available funding.

ENGAGING THE NEXT GENERATION

Engaging the Next Generation is a collaborative program that was established in 2008 by Mobile United and Mobile County Commissioner District 1 Merceria Ludgood to showcase nonprofit organizations in the Mobile area and to connect them with the innovators of the next generation.

FAMILYWIZE PRESCRIPTION SAVINGS CARDS

In partnership with FamilyWize, UWSWA distributes free prescription drug cards that provide savings for individuals with insurance, without insurance, or need medications that are not covered by insurance.

PROJECT BLUEPRINT

Project Blueprint (PBP) is a two-month training and learning opportunity for people interested in learning about nonprofit board structure, board service, nonprofit organizational operations and more. In order to keep our citizens engaged in all processes, it is important to make sure everyone has an understanding of nonprofit board service. Topics covered in the program include: personal responsibility of serving on a nonprofit board, the unique business of nonprofits; and the services available to assist our neighbors who need the help to prosper. PBP is designed to empower the participants in the knowledge of nonprofit operations and rules, board service and is reflective of our diverse community.

Upon completion of the two-month series of informative classes, PBP graduates are ready for placement on local boards of directors and committees.

VOLUNTEER INCOME TAX ASSISTANCE PROGRAM (VITA)

Through the VITA program, UWSWA provides communities with free federal & state e-filing assistance. UWSWA recruits & trains volunteers to assist individuals with tax preparation & to educate taxpayers about the Earned Income Tax Credit (EITC) & other tax credits and filing options.

UNITED WAY 2-1-1

Through a UWSWA partnership with Lifelines Counseling Services, trained specialists provide individuals seeking assistance free & confidential referrals to community services.

UNITED WAY OF SOUTHWEST ALABAMA COMMUNITY RESOURCE NETWORK

The CRN, which started in March 2020 in response to the Covid-19 Outbreak, is a partnership of United Way of Southwest Alabama, USA Office of Community Engagement, and Spring Hill College, Albert S. Foley, S.J. Community Service Center. It was started to bring and share resources to all organizations in need of information. An email List-Serve was created as the main ongoing communication tool.

VOLUNTEER CONNECT

United Way Volunteer Connect is a recruitment & management website that increases volunteerism & mobilizes resources by offering opportunities for individuals & groups to volunteer. It includes an online project calendar & the ability to track volunteers & hours.

WASHINGTON COUNTY DENTAL & VISION PROGRAM

The Washington County Dental and Vision Program provides limited dental and vision care for residents of Washington County who meet specific requirements.

Who Is Eligible?

- Full-time students in Washington County Public Schools through age 19
- Students who are home-schooled in Washington County through age 19
- County residents that have been approved to receive services from The Arc of Southwest Alabama
- Full-time residents of Washington County Nursing Homes
- Participants in Washington County Senior Centers
- Residents approved for the Medicaid Waiver wait list
