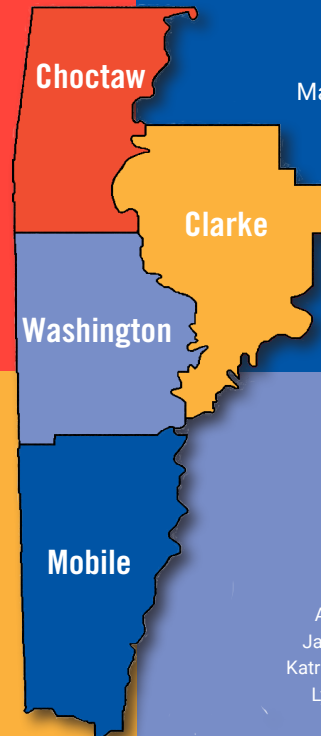

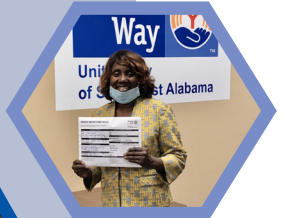

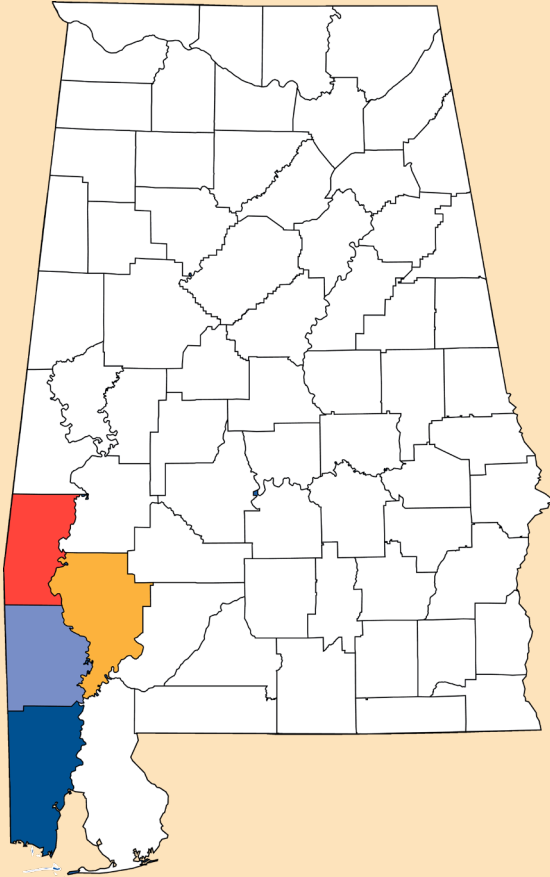

## UNITED WAY 2-1-1

Since its creation in 2007, United Way's 2-1-1 Help Line has been the nation's premier referral resource for people seeking health and human services information. Locally, through a UWSWA partnership with Lifelines Counseling Services, trained and caring call specialists provide direct access to free and confidential referrals to community services for individuals seeking assistance.

- Call specialists provided 1,292 follow-up calls

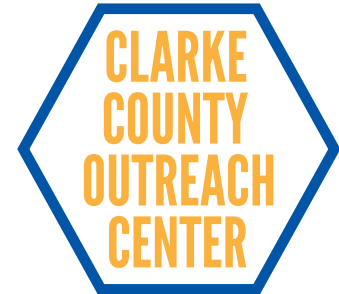


## CLARKE COUNTY OUTREACH CENTER

The Clarke County Outreach Center (CCOC) is a central hub for UWSWA partner agencies and other nonprofits serving Clarke County to meet and provide their full spectrum of services to residents of the county. Having a physical presence in Clarke County helps mitigate challenges as well as increase awareness of the programs and services available to residents. The CCOC was made possible through an Alabama Power Foundation Elevate Grant and the J.L. Bedsole Foundation.

### 2020-21 Community Impact Statistics

- UWSWA and partner agencies served 30 individuals in 2020-21. There was a decline in services available due to Covid-19.



## DOLLY PARTON IMAGINATION LIBRARY

Dolly Parton's Imagination Library (DPIL) is a book gifting program that mails free, high-quality books to children from birth to age five, regardless of their family's income. DPIL was designed to encourage reading to preschool children. Each month after a child is registered – until their fifth birthday – a carefully selected, age-appropriate book is sent to the child's home.

### 2020-21 Community Impact Statistics

- 518 children participated in DPIL in 2020-21 (111 in Choctaw County and 407 in Mobile County)
- UWSWA distributed 4,525 books to children (1,069 in Choctaw County and 3,456 in Mobile County)





# UWSWA INITIATIVES

## ENGAGING THE NEXT GENERATION

Engaging the Next Generation is a collaborative program established in 2008 by Mobile United and Mobile County Commissioner Merceria Ludgood- District 1 to showcase nonprofit organizations in the Mobile area and connect them with the innovators of the next generation. In 2019, UWSWA accepted program management and planning in combination with our Emerging Leaders Affinity Group.

### Community Impact Statistics

- Due to Covid-19, Engaging the Next Generation was cancelled for the 2020-21 year but returned in late 2021.



## PROJECT BLUEPRINT

Project Blueprint (PBP) is an initiative of UWSWA designed to assist partner agencies and other nonprofit organizations become more inclusive and reflective of our diverse community. Upon completion of a series of informative classes, PBP graduates are trained and available for placement on local nonprofit boards and committees.

PBP graduates currently serve at all levels of UWSWA such as Board of Trustees, the Allocations Committee, and special projects like Day of Caring. Local businesses and nonprofit agencies benefit from these volunteers, as do a majority of the United Way of Southwest Alabama agencies.

## SINGLECARE - FORMERLY FAMILYWIZE

SingleCare, a free prescription savings service and discount card, can save individuals up to 80% on medications at most major pharmacies. SingleCare is always free to use and works whether you have insurance or not, because everyone should have access to the lowest prices available for their medications. SingleCare is valid at more than 35,000 pharmacies in the United States including CVS, Walmart, Walgreens, Albertsons, Kroger, H-E-B, Hy-Vee, and Wegmans.

### 2020-21 Community Impact Statistics

- 23,091 individuals used SingleCare to save on their prescriptions
- Individuals saved over \$1.3 million using SingleCare



## UNITED WAY OF SOUTHWEST ALABAMA COMMUNITY RESOURCE NETWORK (CRN)

The CRN, which began in March 2020 in response to the Covid-19 Pandemic, is a partnership between UWSWA, the University of South Alabama Office of Community Engagement, Spring Hill College's Albert S. Foley, S.J. Community Service Center, and other local nonprofits in Choctaw, Clarke, Mobile, and Washington Counties. Members of the network meet regularly to share resources with all organizations that need information or assistance. Members are part of an email List-Serv to maintain ongoing communications.

### 2020-21 Community Impact Statistics

## VOLUNTEER CONNECT

Volunteer Connect (VC) inspires volunteerism and challenges the community to serve. UWSWA educates people about the importance of volunteering and the life changing contributions made by volunteers. Through the VC database, UWSWA joins people who want to volunteer with the right opportunities to serve. Opportunities range from one-time needs, special events, service hours, to ongoing needs.

### 2020-21 Community Impact Statistics

- 3,303 volunteers registered in Volunteer Connect
- Volunteers gave 848 hours of service to UWSWA partners and other local nonprofit agencies
- Volunteer hours equal \$21,412 in economic impact in Southwest Alabama



# UWSWA INITIATIVES

## VOLUNTEER INCOME TAX ASSISTANCE PROGRAM (VITA)

The IRS's Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA) Program offers free basic tax return preparation to qualified individuals who need assistance in preparing their own tax returns including: people who generally make \$58,000 or less; persons with disabilities; and limited English-speaking taxpayers.

All VITA volunteers who prepare returns must take and pass tax law training that meets or exceeds IRS standards. This training includes maintaining the privacy and confidentiality of all taxpayer information. In addition to requiring volunteers to certify their knowledge of the tax laws, the IRS requires a quality review check for every return prepared at a VITA site prior to filing.

### 2020-21 Community Impact Statistics

- UWSWA completed 1,056 2020 tax returns which resulted in \$1,186,439 returned to the local economy through tax refunds and tax credits
- The SAFE Coalition completed 2,594 returns which resulted in \$3,494,247 returned to the local economy through tax refunds and tax credits



## WASHINGTON COUNTY DENTAL & VISION PROGRAM

The Washington County Dental and Vision Program provides limited dental and vision care for residents of Washington County who meet specific requirements.

The Dental Program will cover a maximum of \$750 per year per patient. The Vision Program will cover a maximum of \$300 per year for youth up to the age of 19 and a maximum of \$450 per year for adults.

### 2020-21 Community Impact Statistics

- UWSWA supported one qualifying resident with dental service.
- UWSWA provided \$266 to fund dental services to a Washington dentist.

## Partners Active in Disaster

- American Red Cross Serving South Alabama distributed 46,652 meals and 37,001 disaster supply kits, and provided \$292,738 in emergency funds to 833 families whose homes were destroyed.
- Feeding the Gulf Coast distributed 941,322 pounds of food and water in Mobile County. They distributed 3,152 cases of water and 3,660 pre-packed shelf stable disaster boxes.
- Lifelines Family Counseling received 5,318 calls to United Way 2-1-1 for storm relief and recovery.
- South Alabama Volunteer Lawyers Program opened 125 civil cases for low-income clients with storm related legal issues.
